- 1. Meeting called to order at 7:01 PM by Tadd Hatch
- 2. Meeting Minutes:
 - Motion to approve December 2023 meeting minutes by Kylene Blanchard, Kevin Chaloupecky 2nd.
- 3. Treasurer's Report:
 - Motion to approve the December 2023 treasurer's report by Teresa Koch, Karen Hatch 2nd.
- 4. Directors' Reports
 - Mr. Kolusu
 - Great December for Waukee bands
 - Several students chosen for SCIBA Honor Band
 - Jazz One placed 5th at SCIBA Jazz Festival
 - o 97 students currently signed up for next year band

Tadd suggested giving them what they have asked for this year and then checking numbers so we can adjust for next. Other options include handing them out at the open house night in the fall or purchasing fewer sheets. It was decided it would be a good idea to have extra on hand.

Discussion about asking for donations. Mr. Patterson expressed that because it is honoring the seniors the BPO should pay for them, and it was agreed.
